Pastor's Ponderings By Steve Young

Year-End State of the Church Report

As I've said before, each year United Methodist pastors are required by the UMC's Book of Discipline to "report the state of the church and give an account of her/his pastoral ministry." I've been doing this now for a long time shortly after the first of the year, similar to what the president, the governor, and other State and local officials in government do annually in their "State of" and year-end addresses reflecting on the previous year. However, I did not present this report last year, for 2018, as I intentionally opted to discuss the Special UMC General Conference happening in February last year. Still, here is my report for this past year, 2019, in what I'm calling a "state of the church" report.

Due to the death of my sister-in-law—my wife Kathy's older sister—on Saturday night, January 5, 2019, I took a vacation Sunday the next day, as Walt U. graciously stepped in to lead the revised service. It was supposed to be an Epiphany Holy Communion Sunday, but we postponed communion to the next Sunday when we also remembered our baptisms in a time of renewal, all associated with parts of the Wesley Covenant Renewal Service, something I like to do early in the year every January. Thanks, again, to everyone for your understanding.

Later, after 11 office closings due to Hart Schools' closings for inclement weather, as well as another vacation day to attend my cousin-in-law's funeral, new life came with the premature birth of our second grandchild, Jackson, on February 21. Ten more vacation days were taken by me during his hospitalization at Lansing Sparrow so that we could help watch his brother (and our first grandson), Gabe, in Alma and carry out the previously planned celebration of his own birthday on Sunday, February 24, in Mt. Pleasant. Thanks again for understanding.

This is starting to sound like a "the state of the pastor" report, so let me shift gears to say that things finally started to settle down, sort of, on Ash Wednesday, March 6, with our Pancake Supper and Ashes Service that night (and see announcement elsewhere about this year's event on Wednesday, February 26). Actually, things started picking up at that time with our Lenten Bible Study on Simon Peter, leading to a Holy Maundy Thursday all-day self-serve communion experience and the latest date for Easter over the next eighteen years on April 21.

I started a 5-week Membership Class after that, and five people joined Hart UMC on Pentecost, June 9, with a child baptism as well. Meanwhile, the U. M. Men's group held a well-attended Spaghetti Supper and "Singspiration" event on May 5, and the U. M. Women celebrated Mother's Day on May 12 with "Sundae Sunday" and Father's Day with strawberry shortcake for the entire congregation.

Pastor's Ponderings, cont.

Over the summer we held another UMCOR kit put-together event on July 24, assembling 50 Hygiene Kits and this time coordinated with a collection of Operation Christmas Child shoeboxes, all in conjunction with and following a Christmas in July Sunday worship on July 21. Later in September, on the last Sunday, September 29, we began a new special worship feature for the 5th Sunday of a month, inaugurating a Sunday Sing-along of requested favorite hymns from our United Methodist Hymnal. It could be called a hymn sing, I suppose, but I'm calling it "Scripture and Songs Sunday," with another one held on the fifth Sunday of December, the 29th, and more to come.

On the last Sunday of the month of October we held another popular Trunk 'N Treat event, reaching out to hundreds of community folks with that ministry. Shortly after, on November 8, the U. M. Women sponsored another successful bazaar and lunch, with good participation from the church and community. Then, following a four-session Advent Study, we teamed up with the Hart Congregational United Church of Christ for a community Christmas Eve candle-lighting service.

Throughout the year we continued other annual and on-going ministry activities and events, including hosting Rotary lunches, supporting Wednesday Kids Club during the school year, distributing 25-cent items from the Personal Care Pantry, supporting Women Who Care college mailing projects, promoting Tuesday's Friends activities, promoting summer camps, coordinating Sunday School lessons with worship themes, participating in CROP Walk, shopping for the Christmas Tree Grocery Gathering, and contributing to special giving, while paying our Ministry Shares in full, all enabling us to become an "Engage MI" mission church with all of our programming and generosity! What a joy to be a part of such an active church! Thank you for another year of ministry together!

"Souper Bowl" Collection Underway

For thirty years now, a collection has been taken up across the United States at Super Bowl time and given in full to a local charity. We will participate in this on Super Bowl Sunday, February 2 (as well as the Sunday before, January 26). The 2020 United Methodist Summer Camping program has been scheduled with camps for all ages from kindergarteners (completed) through older adults. After you have registered and made the initial deposit, please bring your paperwork to the church office to receive a camp scholarship (values vary according to camps selected, but a typical full-week scholarship for a regular camp priced around \$400 would approximate \$350 for a United Methodist sponsored camp, and \$300 for a non-United Methodist camp). Pancakes and Ashes Service, February 26

The Season of Lent always begins forty days before Easter, not including Sun-



days. So, with Easter coming on April 12 this year, Lent will begin on Wednesday, February 26. This day is known as Ash Wednesday, named for the practice of placing a small amount of ashes on the forehead of worshipers at services that day. We will have that service that night at 6:30 p.m. in Fellowship Hall, being preceded by a Pancake Supper (by donation) in Fellowship Hall starting at 6:00 p.m. This customary Lenten meal will once again feature our

"POTLUCK TOPPINGS" addition. This means that each household is asked to bring in a favorite pancake topping to share. Everything else will be provided,




thanks to the United Methodist Men's group, so plan to come to both events (although each may be attended separately, of course)!

HART UMC 2019 FINANCIAL SUMMARY REPORT

The annual Audit/Fund balance report is on file with the Church Office and is available upon request. The report reveals that during 2019, we receipted in \$291,408 and disbursed \$258,986 for a positive cash flow of \$32,422. We received 3 unexpected donations in 2019: \$79,410 from the Mereta Spitler Trust and \$24,000 from two of our Congregants. This additional funding along with our Building fund equity, allowed our Church to: Payoff our \$50,000 loan (\$51,038); Reseal our Parking lot (\$4,988); Install automatic doors (\$3,965) Install LED lighting (\$900); Repair our leaking skylight (\$2,750) and replace our Commercial Refrigerator (\$3,290).

Our yearly operational budget was \$155,635 and we expended but \$152,048, (97.7%), or 2.3% under budget. Some of our major disbursements were for non-budget items like the previously stated Building/Improvements, Youth fund activities and Ministry Shares. I am pleased to report that we paid our Conference Ministry Share obligation (\$19,980) in full.
